The Nordic Institute for Migration

- Sweden pre-2015: relatively generous migration policy
- Sweden late autumn 2015/early 2016: a Uturn
 - Border controls and identity checks
 - Temporary legislation, one of the most restrictive in the EU

• 2016-2019: restrictive policies implemented, highly criticised by various stakeholders



The Nordic Institute for Migration

 February 2019: Government suggests a prolongation of the 2016 temporary law, with some revisions regarding e.g. family reunification, permanent residence permits for stateless persons, "the upper secondary school law" (gymnasielagen)
